



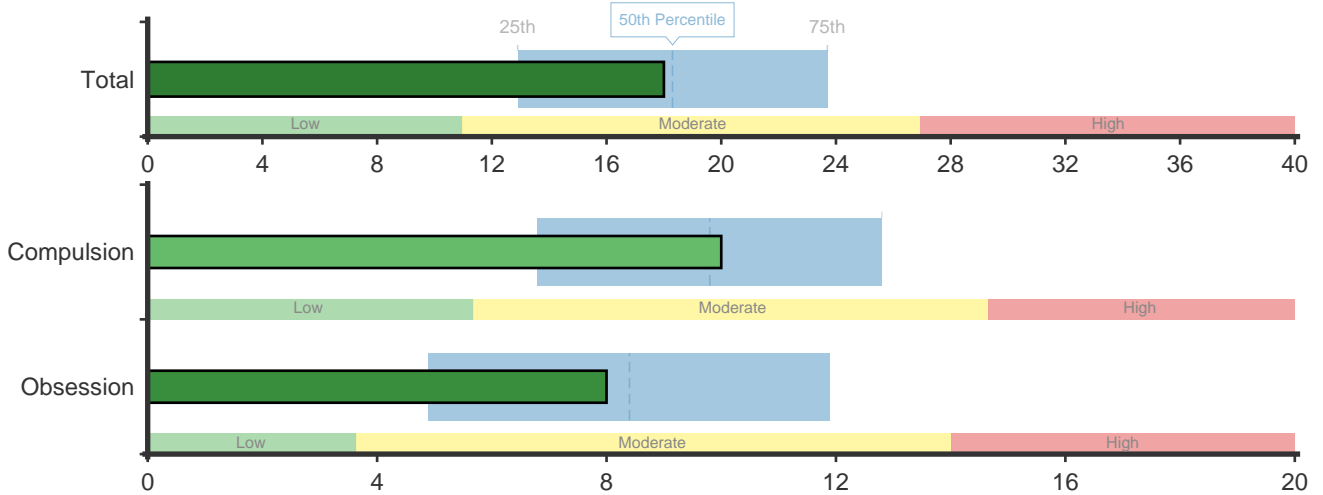

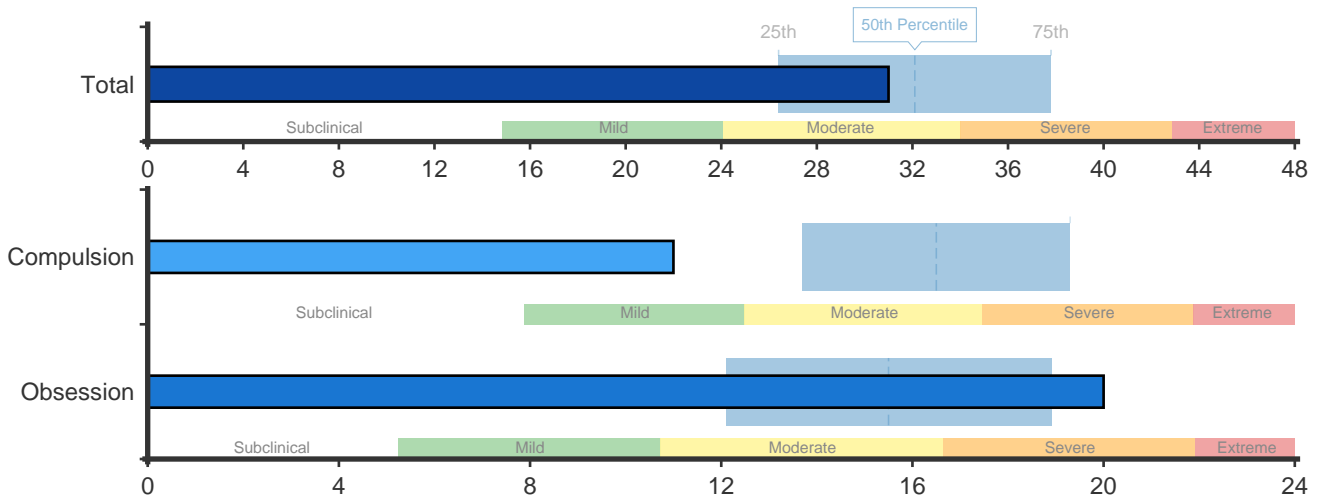

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Interpretation

The parent-report Children's Obsessional Compulsive Inventory–Revised (ChOCI-R-P) was administered on 10 June 2026.

Symptoms: The respondent rated the child at 18 out of a possible 40 on Total Symptoms, placing the child at the 49th percentile. The child's symptoms are considered moderate for children with OCD. This reflected moderate obsessions (8/20) and moderate compulsions (10/20). In particular, the respondent endorsed the following items:

- 2. *They feel they must do ordinary/everyday things exactly the same way, every time they do them. (A lot)*
- 4. *They often have trouble finishing things because they need to make absolutely sure that everything is exactly right. (A lot)*

Impairment: The respondent rated the child at 31 out of a possible 48 on Total Impairment, placing the child at the 45th percentile. The child's functional impairment is considered moderate for children with OCD. This reflected severe impairment from obsessions (20/24) and mild impairment from compulsions (11/24). In particular, the respondent endorsed the following items:

- 33. *How much time do they spend thinking about these things? (More than 8 hrs. a day (almost all the time they are awake))*
- 36. *How hard do they try to stop the thoughts or ignore them? (They don't resist at all)*

The respondent's open-text descriptions of the child's habits (items 11 to 13) and thoughts (items 30 to 32) appear in the Client Responses section and may guide formulation.
